- 6. The Mayor has expressed his desire to increase the tree canopy of Wilmington, which is currently at an estimated 48.2%. Staff will be working with the Tree Commission on this initiative. Staff will also be partnering with a research class from UNCW (the instructor, Dr. Alana Seaman is on the Tree Commission). Dr. Seaman will introduce to the students the idea that the city wants to promote tree planting, tree education, maintenance, etc. and then allow them to determine the exact course of research which will be done by 8 or 9 groups of students, so each group may pick different aspects to research. Staff will meet periodically to get updates regarding how things are progressing and will share with the board. If anyone is interested in working on this project, please let me know.
- 7. Since the county board members were unable to attend in November, we will be meeting in February. There will be an open discussion item on the agenda, so please come with things to discuss.
- 8. Working with Marian to figure out distribution of the monthly report as suggested during our November meeting.
