

(Outdoor Entertainment)

May not exceed designated sound levels at any point 100 feet from the sound and boundary line of premises from which the sound originates.



NOISE VIOLATION DETERMINATION PROCESS

BOTH CURRENT & NEW versions allow officer to cite **WITHOUT** a sound meter but CURRENT provides no real guidance

NEW version adds 12 factors for officer to consider before citing without a sound level meter – MORE objective than CURRENT

NEW version clarifies that measurement is made at complaining property



PROHIBITIONS & EXCEPTIONS



NO lawnmowers/power tools outside at night

NO garbage collection in residential areas at night

NO non-govt construction in residential & downtown areas at night

YES to necessary business equipment, if certain conditions met

YES to outdoor athletic events & events at City venues during the day

PROPOSED PERMITTING PROCESS

Permit ONLY for activity that EXCEEDS or should be REASONABLY EXPECTED to exceed sound levels OR time limits

More reasonable appeal process for denial of permit

One permit for up to thirty (30) events w/in 1 yr of each other

Ten (10) factors that must be considered to grant/deny a permit

No requirement to notify adjoining property owners

CHANGES TO OWNER/OCCUPANT RESPONSIBILITY

ALL responsible persons PRESENT should be listed on the same citation & NOT cited separately

Property owners liable for third+ violations of tenants, guests, or licensees, after being noticed

Clarifies when fines can be escalated

PROPOSED APPEAL PROCESS

Appeals filed within ten (10) days with Police Chief

Penalty stayed during appeal period


Chief shall issue written determination within ten (10) working days

Appellant can appeal Chief's decision to Superior Court
