Annual Financial Report on Fees from Building Code Enforcement Program

The Office of the Fire Marshal conducts all fire and life safety code enforcement activities through building plans examination in addition to onsite inspections. Fire inspectors are trained and certified through national certification processes to determine code violations and to offer violation remedies. Fire inspectors follow state code and local ordinances to ensure that public buildings are safe for occupancy, and in the event of an emergency, occupants can safely escape. Inspections of all commercial occupancies are required by the North Carolina Fire Prevention Code based on the type of occupancy. A fee is charged for all general and permitted inspections, which include hazardous, institutional, industrial, high rise, assembly and residential.
