BIASED BASED POLICING

The Wilmington Police Department is dedicated to addressing and removing biases from the act of law enforcement.

There were three complaints alleging biasedbased policing out of 51 citizen complaints filed in 2019. That's a decrease of four complaints from 2018, or a 57 percent decrease.

All three allegations involved a traffic stop and all three were unfounded.

Early Warning System

The Wilmington Police Department
Professional Standards Division utilizes a
multi-faceted Personal Early Warning
System (IAPRo) to track use-of-force
incidents, pursuit involvement, citizen
complaints, internal investigations,
officer-involved crashes, officer-involved
injuries/fatalities, and departmental
property losses. When an officer meets
or exceeds the threshold for these
incidents (set by the dept.), an alert is
sent out to the first line supervisor and
affected employee.



In 2019, Professional Standards sent out 58 alerts and all 58 were received.

VEHICLE PURSUITS

Wilmington police pursued 38 vehicles in 2019. The majority of pursuits, 26, covered two miles or less and the most common time for pursuits was between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m.
