To file a complaint:

Any <u>one</u> of the following conditions will cause a dwelling unit to be unfit for Human Habitation.:


- 1. Leaning interior walls rendering unsafe conditions.
- Deterioration of the 1/3 of the supporting members; 1/3 deterioration of the outside walls or siding.
- 3. Insufficient strength or improperly distributed loads of floor and/or roof system..
- 4. Fire or wind damage resulting in unsafe conditions.
- Dangerous health and safety conditions from dilapidation, decay or unsanitary conditions.
- 6. Inadequate means of egress.
- 7. Conditions allowing fire or other accidents.
- 8. Lacking adequate ventilation, light, heating and/or sanitary conditions.
- 9. Lacking proper electrical, plumbing and/or facilities.



## **MINIMUM HOUSING CODE PROCESS**

## Adopted Minimum Housing Code Process

- The City of Wilmington has adopted a Minimum Housing Code to establish minimum standards for all residential dwellings. These standards are set forth to insure the safety and structural well being of the unit.
- Properties that do not meet these requirements are subject to enforcement procedures as defined in the code.
- Inspections for Code Standards are generated by a citizen, or by complaints of observation of a Code Enforcement Officer. The inspection results may cause a dwelling unit to be categorized as unfit for human habitation, or the dwelling unit may contain other minimum housing code violations that could potentially lead to unfit conditions.
