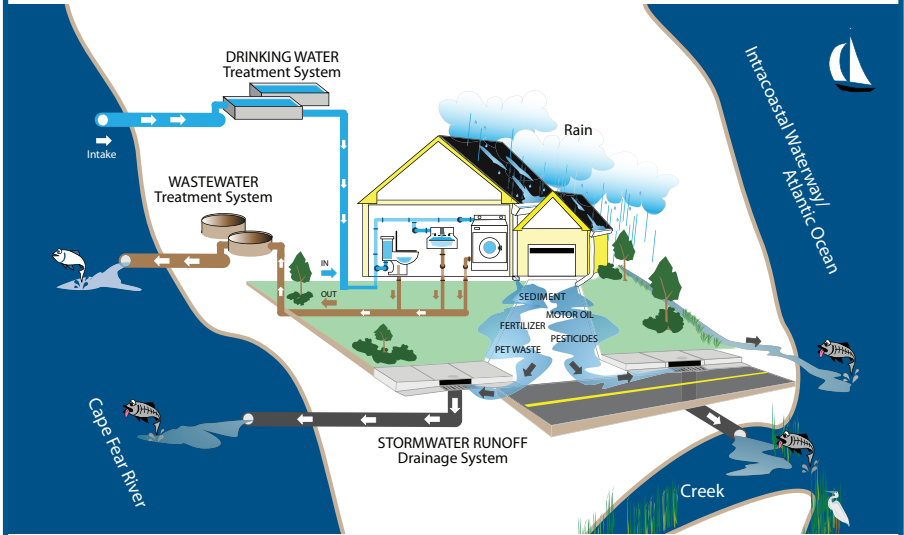


Do you know how your water flows?



#1 SOURCE OF POLLUTION

Stormwater runoff is the number one source of continuing pollution in Bradley and Hewletts Creeks.

Impervious, or hard surfaces like roads and driveways prevent rainwater from soaking into the ground. Instead, the water becomes stormwater runoff, picking up pollutants and carrying them directly into our waterways where we like to fish, swim and boat.

As a resident or business in the Bradley or Hewletts Creek Watershed, you play a key role in the future health of these creeks. Understanding where stormwater goes is the first step towards healing our waterways.
