Tips For a healthy and safe neighborhood

Keep Grass Mowed Front and back to the street. Rodents and other pests love tall grass, and weeds.

Keep Shrubbery Cut Back from streets and sidewalks.

Get Rid of Trash

This includes litter, scrap metal and construction debris. Piles of trash and debris can lead to disease, injury or fire.

Remove Junk Vehicles

Junk and broken-down vehicles are dangerous, especially to children.

Keep Indoor Furniture,

Appliances and Electronics Off Porches and Yards Rodents and other critters love these too.

Remove Hazardous Waste from property i.e., tires, combustibles agents and batteries.

Remove accumulation of water. Containers that hold water contribute to mosquito problem in the area.

Remove Graffiti Urban Art and/or Tagging lowers property values and are unsightly in appearance

Illegal Occupancy Occupying dwelling without utilities, broken windows, promotes criminal activities.
